CHURCH MAINTENANCE

When we come to church for Mass or a liturgical gathering, we usually see a decorated altar, a clean church, perhaps some flowers, filled holy water fonts and generally, a church interior that is in order and ready for worship.

This happens because a few good volunteers have made it so. In order that we have inspiring liturgies and good order inside church, we need people to set this in motion before the Mass ever begins. Your willingness to help **does not** bind you to keep doing so

Keeping up the church usually does not involve much time. Cleaning altar cloths, for example, can be done with your own laundry. But if these small but essential tasks are not done, it soon leads to things being out of order and unrecognizable.

CHURCH MAINTENANCE





Outside of wintertime, our cemetery grounds collect debris and sticks. These need to be picked up, as needed, usually once or twice, between Memorial and Labor Days. The fence line also needs trimming, and the frequency of trimming depends upon rainfall, usually needed once or twice a month.

Church Garden Weeding/Trimming




Outside of winter, our tiered gardens in front and on the side of church need periodic weeding. The hedges in front need trimming. Weeding, from around Memorial Day to Labor Day, is done as needed. Trimming is twice a season. Once done. it becomes quicker next time, and the flowers and shrubs look so much nicer.

Cleaning Altar Cloths



The vessels for Mass each have a folded and pressed white cloth (purificator). Vestments and altar paraments go to the cleaners, but the altar cloths and purificators need laundering, starch and ironing, twice a month.

Decorating Altar Area




Christmas and Easter are two major times for this, but other times (Pentecost, Advent and Lent, e.g.) may also call for decoration. Sundays may also allow for an altar tableau, relating to the Gospel. This is done with symbols and fabric, on an as needed basis, within the liturgical season.

Dusting the Church




There are many corners and small openings inside the church—perfect spots for cobwebs or dust to accumulate. Dusting is needed, about twice a month, to keep these two at bay. Our staff will take care of vacuuming, but dusting is an ongoing need.

Filling Holy Water Fonts





Votive Candles/Candle Wax Removal

After Mass, our four altar candles often need to have the dripped wax removed. If this is attended to regularly, it can be done about three times a month. At the same time, any votive candles that have burned out need replacement. This can be checked weekly.





We have green plants throughout the church interior. In order that they do not turn brown and die, they need periodic watering. This is on as an needed basis.
