Parish Events

St. Martin Parish Picnic

Our annual picnic is not a fund raising event, but a social outing of fun for the families of the parish. It usually takes place the first Sunday of August.

Flower Sale

Each year we offer various flowers and plants for sale, around Mother's Day.

Retreats

The Emmaus Women's group has an annual retreat in the fall. The parish has its own retreat in September.

Cold Weather Clothing for Kids

CWC4K is our outreach to needy area grade school students. Each fall, we offer winter clothing items to local students in need. This includes jackets, mittens, caps, boots, scarves and other winter outdoor gear.

Bake and Craft Sale

The Catholic Council of Women organize an annual bakery and craft sale around Thanksgiving each year.

Rummage Sale

Our parish Men's Club meets monthly, and at Memorial Day, offers a rummage sale of used goods to the public.



Mass was first celebrated in the church of St. Martin's on November 11, **1898**, the feast day of St. Martin of Tours. St. Martin was named the patron saint of the parish to honor the first non-martyr with an annual feast in the Roman calendar.

In 1907, we became a mission of St. John the Evangelist parish of Gillett and remained such until 1937. At that time, we became a mission of Sacred Heart parish of Shawano. In 1939, a thirty foot addition was added to the back of the church building. This increased the seating capacity to 175. In 1962, a \$40,000 project added to the church a parish hall, kitchen facilities and a new church entrance.

In 1979, the church was again expanded to increase the space available for the parish. In 1984, we became a co-parish with St. John's of Gillette . In 1994, we became a co-parish of Sacred Heart (Shawano). Finally, in 2000, we were designated as a parish in our own right and Deacon Tom Craig was assigned as parish director. In 2010, the parish hall was expanded to add religious education classrooms and space for the St. Martin Parish Food Pantry. This also increased our ability to accommodate people in the church and in the parish hall,



Parish and Finance Councils

Our parish and finance councils meet regularly to review pending issues and consult with the pastoral Leader. Each council has standing committees. <u>The Parish Council</u> has the Liturgy Committee, the Helping Hands-Outreach Committee, and the Education-Youth Committee.

The *Liturgy* Committee helps plan liturgies, prayer services and oversees worship music and the decoration of the church.

The Helping Hands Committee oversees the monthly Food Pantry and plans outreach to various people and groups in need.

The Education-Youth Committee oversees the Religion Education program, and various youth oriented events put on by the parish and adult education events.

<u>The Finance Council</u> has two standing committees, the Building & Grounds Committee and the Cemetery Committee.

The Building & Grounds Committee oversees the maintenance and upkeep of the facilities of the parish.

The Cemetery Committee oversees the maintenance and upkeep of our parish cemetery, located about 3 blocks away.

Catholic Council of Women

Membership in the CCW is open to any woman of the parish. They put on various parish dinners, and a bakery and craft fund raising event around Thanksgiving.

St. Martin Catholic Parish Men's Club

Membership in the Men's Club is open to all men of the parish. They meet once a month for good food and good talk, including a spiritual topic. They take care of needed outdoor projects.

Miscellaneous Needs

Our parish volunteers are the backbone of the parish. They help with spring cleanup, decorate and keep up the church, organize and staff our monthly Food Pantry, oversee the parish picnic, and the Christmas Giving Tree project. At Mass, our volunteers act as Greeters, Servers, Lectors, Ushers and Eucharistic Ministers and provide music at Mass.
